2018 NSW SCHOOLS FENCING PROGRAM

NSWFA's new-look fencing program for school-aged fencers has been finalised and sent to School Fencing Co-ordinators.

The program differs from the traditional NSW schools fencing program. It offers eight Saturdays of fencing for each participant, more like a regular school sport. There will be three days of poules rounds to decide the individual championships and five days of teams. The greater emphasis on teams was recommended by schools after the success of the U15 boy's foil premiership last year. The program also reflects the desire of schools to have more competition days but less time spent per day for fencers and their families. The traditional Roberta Nutt and AJ Rae/Roseanne White competitions will be retained within the championship program.

All participants will be entitled to a \$100 Active Kids voucher credited by NSWFA against the cost of entry.

The final calendar will be posted to the website in early March and the competition program starts 24 March.

Marion and Loic (both 15 years old) practise fencing in their home cities and hope to continue their interest while on exchange in Australia arranged by the World Education Program (WEP). Marion is French and fences foil. Loic is from Belgium and fences all three weapons. They both love keeping active and fit and also enjoy a number of other sports and hobbies. These students will be arriving in Australia in mid-July this year for 10 month (Marion) and 5 month (Loic) exchange programs. Once a generous, volunteer host family has been approved, WEP will arrange school enrolment, flights, visas etc. so host families can just get on with getting to know their chosen student before they arrive in Australia. They are both arriving in mid-July. Marion has chosen an academic year program (returns at the start of June 2019) and Loic is on a semester program and returns to Belgium at the start of December this year. Both students are eager to become valued members of welcoming local families in Australia.

Membership renewals for 2018 are now open on the <u>NSWFA website</u>. Membership is for the full year. The cost of membership is the same as in 2017.

Junior Registered	Junior fencer (born 2000 or earlier – under 18 on 1 January)	\$40	Eligible for NSW Schools (all ages) and Mini (U14/U12/U10/U8) State competitions. Non-voting status.
Coach		\$200	Voting status
Associate		\$40	Non-competing member. Non-voting status.

Membership payments include GST and the AFF Capitation Fee (per member charge)

CLUB REGISTRATION

All fencing clubs are invited to be affiliated/registered with the NSW Fencing Association in 2018. The benefits of club affiliation/registration are:

- Insurance coverage for personal injury, public liability and professional indemnity risk.
- A full listing of club details on the NSWFA website.
- Participation in NSWFA club team competitions

This year, are asking clubs to provide more information about their membership, including the number of regular club fencers who are not competitive fencers affiliated or registered with NSWFA and the number of 'come and try' fencers who have visited your club. This information is needed for our reports to the NSW Office of Sport and to the AFF for its reports to the Australian Sports Commission.

It is important that we count every participant.

Club membership categories:

Affiliated Club: A club with 10 or more members who are Affiliated/Registered members of NSWFA (either Senior or Junior): \$208

Registered Club: A club with fewer than 10 members who are Affiliated/Registered members of NSWFA. Typically, these are 'start up' clubs or small clubs in metro and regional areas.

NOTICE TO ALL COACHES - 2018 COACH ACCREDITATION

These items must be uploaded to the AFF Portal (link) by ALL coaches in order to be re-accredited for 2018.

- First Aid Certificate The certificate must be dated within the last three years, otherwise the course must be done again.
- Coaching General Principles The General Principles Certificate must be dated within the last three years, otherwise the course must be done again.
- Coaching Hours doc form attached and verified
- Coaching Activities doc form attached and verified


