NSWFA SCORES A \$50k GRANT

NSW Fencing has been awarded a \$50,000 grant to make capital improvements to the NSW Fencing Centre this year. The money is being provided under the NSW Government's Sport Development Program.

The Board is now considering which elements of the Capital Works Program can proceed. The Program includes upgrading pistes, improving ventilation and other options. The NSWFA President, Kaye Mahoney, has personally thanked the Minister for Sport, Stuart Ayres, for his approval of our grant application.

AND A DEFIBRILLATOR

The NSW Fencing Centre will soon be equipped with a defibrillator (heart starter) under a NSW Government program. Well done to Caitlin Fox-Harding who secured the grant. Though let's hope we never have to use it.

SCHOOLS FENCING - TERM 2

The NSW School Age Fencing Program kicks off again on Saturday 5 May after the holiday break. All up, 421 students from 29 schools have entered this year's schools program and there are 56 team entries.

The AFF has published the entry process for the Australian Schools Championships to be held at the NSW Fencing Centre later this year – Senior Individual and Teams on 28/29 July and Intermediate Individual and Teams on 25/26 August.

There have been some changes to the process. For example, there will be two rounds of entries for individual and team events, depending on the number of entries received in the first round.

The pathway to nomination for the Australian Schools Championships is via the NSW School Age Fencing Championships. The top 4 fencers from the national schools individual qualifier (Roberta Nutt) and the top two teams from the team qualifier (AJ Rae/Roseanne White 5 week program) are automatically selected. Other nominations will be based on results.
