NSW HOSTS AUSTRALIAN SCHOOLS CHAMPIONSHIPS

For the first time, NSWFA has hosted the Australian Schools Championships with 149 individual fencers and 22 teams taking part in the Intermediate and Senior Championships in July and August. All up, students from 39 schools competed, predominantly from NSW. Participation was considerably higher than in recent years and we are expecting larger numbers with greater interest from interstate schools next year.

The national schools events ran smoothly with full marks to our schools co-ordinator, Jacqueline Fontaine for organizing the entry process and devising the timetable; to Edwin Lapitan who managed the DT role, to all our hardworking referees and to the café crew led by Kerry Taylor.

With the Commonwealth Veterans Championships and other important competitions for veterans (AFC#4 in Sydney and the Oceania Veterans in Melbourne) coming up, NSWFC is offering a training opportunity for veterans who want to get in some extra practice and sharpen their skills against other veteran fencers. Veterans are invited to attend NSWFC from 6pm to 9pm on Thursday evenings for 10 weeks from 6 September to 15 November.

Dedicated pistes will allow you to make the best of your training time.

The cost of each training session is \$20 – take the whole 10-week program for \$180. This cost does not apply to fencers who have already joined NSWFC programs.

Teams for the Open and Veterans competitions will be chosen according to the NSWFA Selection Policy. The first three highest ranked fencers will be pre-selected and the fourth place will be filled according to results in the individual event.


ENTRY RULES FOR NSW FENCING CENTRE




