PRESIDENT SUMS UP A SUCCESSFUL YEAR FOR NSW FENCING

In her President's Report to the NSWFA annual general meeting on 24 March, Kaye Mahoney highlighted the main achievements for NSWFA in 2018. She noted:

- Our fencers again won five of the six Australian championships points trophies.
- We had 19 Australian champions, winning over half the gold medals at championship events.
- Participation in State competitions grew by 15%.
- We hosted four major multi-day competitions.
- The new format school age fencing program proved a success.
- We invested more to improve the NSW Fencing Centre.

Kaye reported a significant increase in competition attendance in 2018 – up by some 15% on the previous year. The strongest growth was in youth (under 20) participation with competition entries up 22%. Although membership of NSWFA by competitive fencers remained fairly stable, we can report a significant increase in overall participation to some 2,500 as clubs provided us with more detail on the number of club fencers who don't show up in our competition attendance numbers and those who visited their club to try out fencing.

Kaye said that while these numbers are encouraging, we need to maintain upward momentum in competition attendance across the board through effective marketing and organic growth. Growth in participation, competition entries and hence revenue is a strategic priority.

BOARD ELECTIONS





At the AGM Sara Scott and Jing Shang were elected as Directors. Both were previously on the Board; Sara was appointed last year to fill a casual vacancy and Jing was an Appointed Director. Sara is the President of the University of Sydney Fencing Club and is completing a Masters degree. Jing ran a successful fencing business in Shanghai before moving to Sydney recently. Her children Sophia and Joseph are keen fencers.

Kathleen Baxter 28 November 1930 - 23 March 2019

It is with sadness that we acknowledge the passing of Kathleen (Katie) Baxter.

Katie began her fencing career at The Swords Club in 1949 and went on to compete at the Rome Olympics in 1960. Katie initially made the switch from tennis to fencing as wet weather had interfered with her playing so she decided to try an indoor sport. She took lessons from Owen Weingott before moving to Professor Joan Beck.

In 1951, she competed in her first National Championships in Brisbane. She was a reserve team member for the Australian Team in the 1958 British Empire and Commonwealth Games in Cardiff, Wales. By 1959 she had won the NSW State Open Women's Foil and National Women's Open Foil titles which saw her inclusion in the Australian Fencing Team for the 1960 Olympic Games in Rome. Like other Fencing Team members, she was required to raise seven hundred and forty—nine pounds to secure her team place. TSC members rallied around Katie and other fellow club members, including Brian McCowage and David McKenzie to assist in raising the necessary funds.

During the Olympics, she won two bouts but it was not sufficient for her to promote to the next round. However, the wonderful experience of her first Olympics stayed with her for the rest of her life. Employment with American Express enabled Katie to travel to many countries to fence and train. She continued to compete in State and National competitions up until 1967 and fenced on a casual basis through to 1979.

Katie was a sectional manager for the tragedy-marred Munich Olympic Games and held roles as Secretary and Delegate for New South Wales Fencing and The Swords Club.

Katie was held in high esteem in the Australian Fencing community and will always be remembered with great fondness.

Her funeral will be held in Bowral on Wednesday 3 April. Further details will be advised in due course.
