## **EQUIPMENT STANDARDS**

## Note:

- The equipment standards shown here are the <u>minimum</u> requirements. Fencers may use equipment of a higher standard.
- For ALL fencers of any age the required standard for under-plastrons is 800N.
- All masks must comply with the FIE 'double strap' standard.
- Gloves must be in good condition without any holes.
- These standards apply to both competition and training at the NSW Fencing Centre

Note A: for NSW schools – except for Novices, fencers must wear 'full whites' – 800N underplastron, 350N jacket & breeches and long socks. Novices may wear tracksuit pants. Girls must wear a chest protector. Foil masks do not require bibs.

Note B: for U8/U10 fencers – blade sizes are 0-3 for all weapons; girls must wear a chest protector; boys must wear a chest protector for epee (optional for foil and sabre). Breeches & long socks must be worn. Foil masks do not require bibs.

Note C: for U12/U14 fencers – blade sizes are 0-5 (up to full size) for all weapons; girls must wear a chest protector; boys must wear a chest protector for epee (optional for foil and sabre). Breeches & long socks must be worn. Foil masks do not require bibs.

Good condition means a weapon with a clean blade (no rust), no jagged edges, a properly fixed guard without major dents and good taping on foils.

During the Covid-19 period, equipment should be sanitised each time it is used – use a sanitary wipe to clean weapon/wires, a sanitary spray for masks and wash clothing.

Weapon checks are not undertaken at NSWFA competitions – fencers are responsible for checking their own equipment. Please consult your coach or the NSWFC armourer if in doubt.

Referees will check under-plastrons (must be 800N) and double strapped masks on the piste before competition begins.

These rules are based on the NSWFA Equipment & Safety Policy 2014 and the Equipment Standards for Minime Fencers (U8-U14) 2020.
