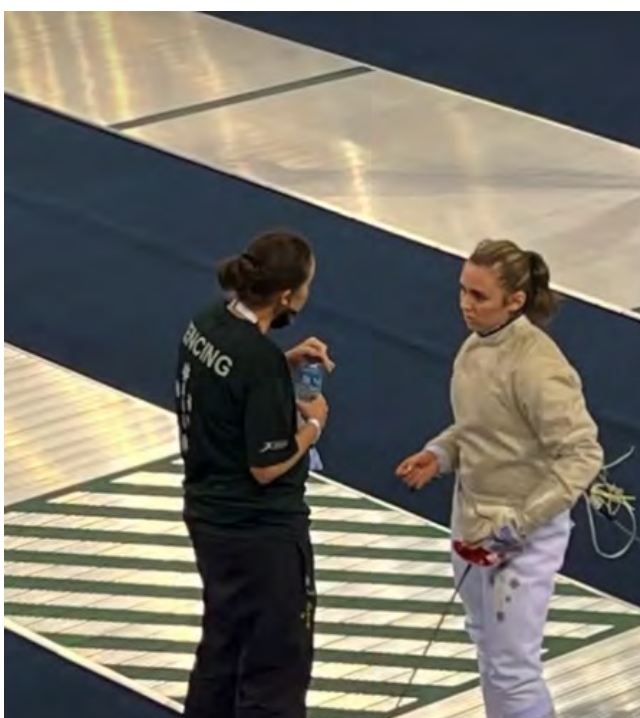
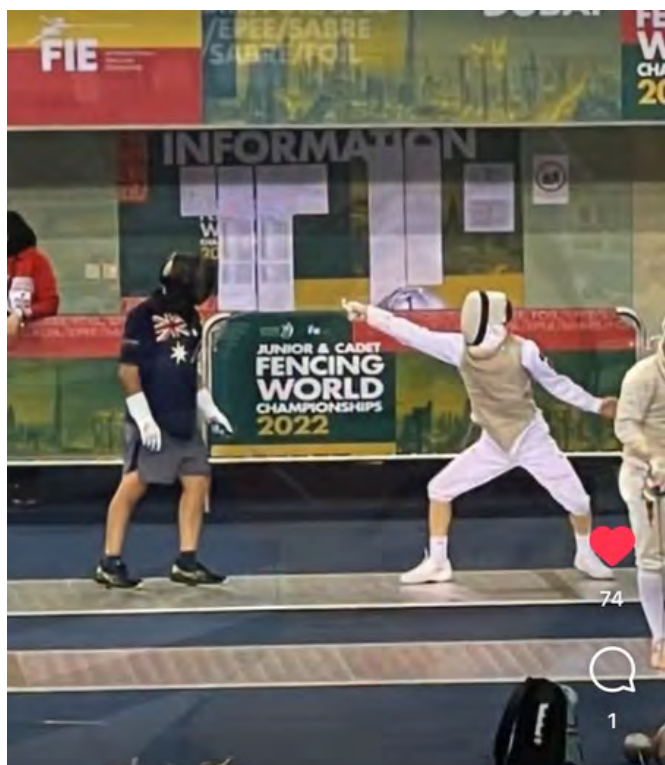
## 2022 Cadet and Junior World Championships 2-10 April, Dubai UAE

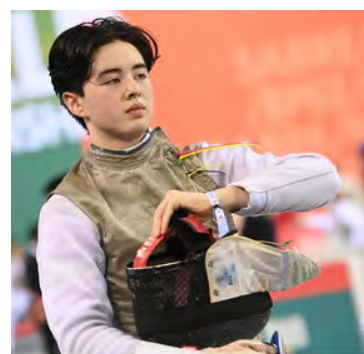

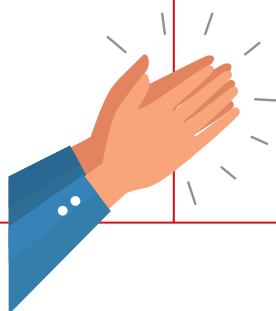

## 2022 Cadet and Junior World Championships 2-10 April, Dubai UAE

To wrap up the experience and to begin looking ahead, we would like to share Epeeist Nawal O'Neil's reflection with you:



“Upon receiving my invitation to compete for Australia in the 2022 Junior World Championships, I was overwhelmed with pride, excitement and anxiety. This was my first major international tournament. Given the small competitor field in Australia, I really had no idea what to expect.

The tournament was held in Dubai, where our family lived for two years, between 2008 and 2010. So, I was looking forward to triggering some fond memories of such a perplexing city.

I was reminded that my time in Dubai wasn't all fencing and tourism; I also needed to keep up with my schoolwork as I am currently in Year 12.

When we arrived at Dubai's Hamdan Sports Complex, one of the largest multi-purpose sporting facilities in the world, the magnitude of the competition dawned on me. I had never seen so many fencers together in my life! The scale and professionalism of the venue were well beyond my expectations and it was incredibly patriotic to see all the competitors wearing their country uniforms.

In my tournament, the Junior Women's Épée, there were 161 fencers. My personal goal was Table of 64. Following the pools, I was placed 106. In my first Direct Elimination, I lost 15 - 13 to Mihaela Stefanova from Bulgaria, who ended up placing 23.

On reflection, the tournament was a great experience both mentally and physically. I connected with many people from around the world, including my fencing coach from London, where we lived from 2010 to 2017.

Although I didn't get the result I was hoping for, I learnt a lot about myself and will forever remember this incredible experience.

Thank you so much to everyone who made it possible and to everyone who supported me throughout the trip!”

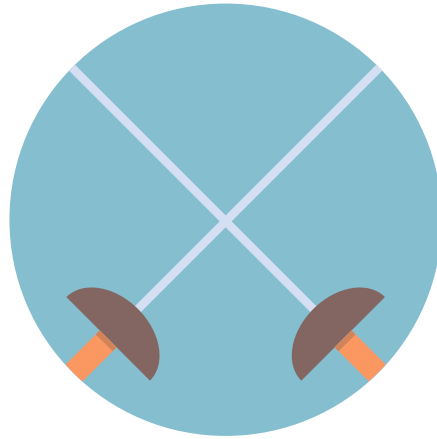

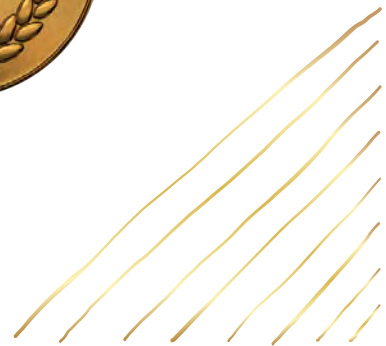
## Australian Fencing Circuit #1

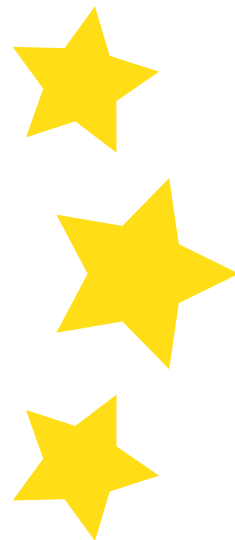

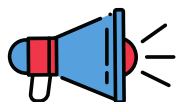


## NSW Coaching Protocol

NSWFA has set a new Coaching Protocol to clarify the roles of coaches at National, State and School competitions. This protocol is intended to ensure fairness when NSW fencers are competing against each other at National, State and Schools competitions.

A key point is that designated State coaches are not permitted to coach a NSW fencer at a National competition unless the other NSW fencer has a personal coach.

## Covid Restrictions Lifted



The NSWFA Board has agreed that from Wednesday 27 April the Covid rules applying to the NSW Fencing Centre will largely be removed.

The Board has taken into account the latest advice from the NSW Government, high community vaccination levels, declining case numbers and the AFF's decision to no longer require proof of vaccination to national competitions.

So, with immediate effect:

- + Proof of Covid vaccination or medical exemption will no longer be required on entry to the Fencing Centre.
- + The wearing of face masks when not actively competing or training will not be compulsory, but will continue to be strongly recommended.
- + Capacity limits will not be applied, though we request only one spectator per fencer for state competitions including school competitions.
- + Fencers and others who test positive or develop flu-like symptoms must not attend the Centre. Under Government rules, anyone who tests positive must self-isolate for 7 days.
- + In line with official advice, household or close contacts of positive cases without symptoms may attend the Centre but should wear a face mask.
- + Sensible hygiene measures should continue to be taken, including:
  - regular use of hand sanitiser on entry to and while at the Fencing Centre
  - minimise personal contact, e.g. no hand shaking/high fives
  - do not swap clothing and equipment
  - maintain social distance wherever possible



The need for Covid measures will continue to be reviewed and may be changed depending on the future course of the pandemic and official advice.

Affiliated clubs may choose to adopt this policy.

President Jing Shang notes that the effective removal of Covid measures hopefully brings to an end 25 months of disruption to fencing, including enduring long lockdowns in 2020 and 2021.

“I thank everyone in the fencing community for their patience, tolerance and co-operation with the measures NSWFA has taken to protect our fencers, coaching staff, volunteers and fencing families. We came through it together - let’s all hope it is now over.”

In particular, Jing thanks our Covid Marshal, Carla Harbison-Hardge; the coaching team led by Antonio Signorello; regular volunteers like Kerry Taylor and Niki Whelan; and our armourer Jeff Hardge for their efforts in keeping the Fencing Centre as safe as possible during the pandemic.

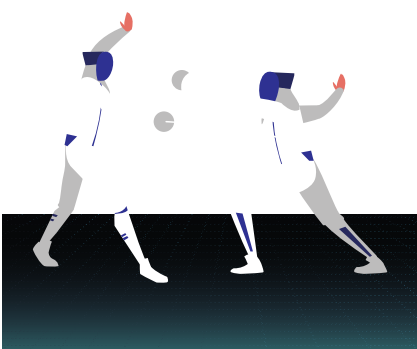
## **NSW Alternative Events to the State Championships 2022 (Senior, Cadet and U15)**

Should anyone miss a State Championship for his or her chosen age group, he or she may join an approved Alternative Event of the same age group and the same weapon to qualify for the respective National Championship.

Based on the current 2022 competition calendar, the following are approved Alternative Events for Seniors, Cadets and U15s in NSW. State Championships are also listed for your reference.

Please note that AFF national ranking points will be awarded for State Championships but not for Alternative Events.

Veterans - While veterans are not required to attend the NSW Veteran Championship to qualify for entry to the Australian Veterans Championships, if they want to compete in the Australian Senior (Open) Championships, as many do, they will have to enter the NSW Open Championships or a designated Alternative Event.

Over the April school holiday, a few of our fencers travelled to the United States to compete in the North American Cup (Charlotte), a national circuit event.

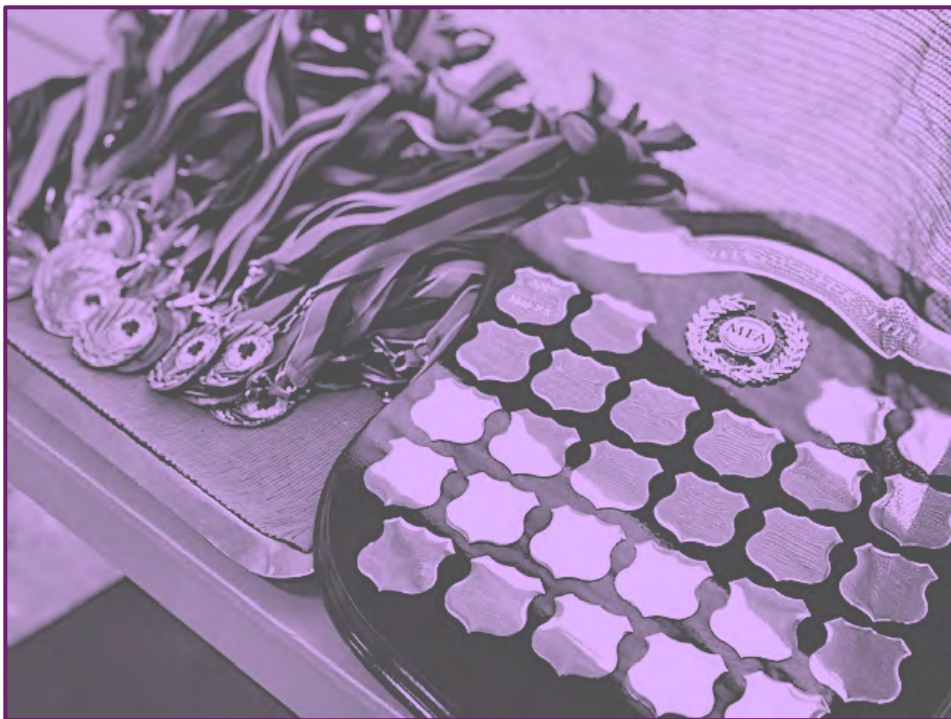
