New registration software



When NSWFA members join up for 2023, you'll notice a couple of changes.

First, there'll be a new and better system for membership and competition entry.

We're moving to a new platform called Assemble which promises a simpler and easier process for signing up as a member, entering competitions, booking a place at fencing camps and so on.

You'll only have to enter your details once. You'll no longer have to repeat them each time you register for a competition then again for a second event.

Parents will be able to enter more than one child in more than one event.

The new system will start from 1 January 2023.

Fencing Victoria started using Assemble this year and by all accounts members have found it a much-improved system.

Second, the description of membership categories will change. Instead of 'Affiliated' and 'Registered', which can be confusing, especially for newcomers, the choice will be 'Competitive' or 'Participative', the same terms used by the AFF.

'Competitive' replaces 'Affiliated' and will cover fencers who compete seriously in State, National and International events.

Fencers over 18 will be known as Senior Competitive and those below 18 as Junior Competitive.

'Participative' replaces 'Registered' and will cover club fencers, school fencers and fencers under the age of 14. Those over 18 will be classed as Senior Participative; those under 18 will be Junior Participative.

Third, there'll be a new type of membership called Club Fencer. These members will be able to take part in regional championships and NSWFA club teams events. Senior Club Fencers (+18) will be able to vote at General Meetings of NSWFA.

Further details on the new membership structure will be posted by the end of this year.

The annual general meeting for NSWFA members will be held at 4pm, Sunday 26 February 2023 at the NSW Fencing Centre.


Formal notice of the meeting will be sent to all voting members in January.

So, parents, please be positive and supportive, not critical and overbearing. Applaud good play from both young fencers on the piste.


Please respect coaches, referees, the DT and our volunteers.
