NSW fencers were prominent in the Australian teams which performed well, notably the Junior Women's Sabre Team (Gaia Hardge, Yelin Zou, Lily Fallon, Veronika Vasileva) which placed 5th in JWS just missing the podium. Cadet Men's Foil Team (Tommaso Signorello, Joseph Glasson) finished 6th out of 16 teams. Junior Women's Foil Team (Sophia Glasson, Amelia Whelan) finished 6th out of 13 teams.

Robyn Chaplin Memorial Tournament AFC#1 Foil and Sabre

From 11-12 March, NSW welcomed all foil and sabre fencers to the NSW Fencing Centre for our first Australian Fencing Circuit event for 2023. Over the 2 days, NSW delivered some formidable fencing across our Senior and Veteran categories.

The podium was awash with blue as NSW fencers claimed all medals in Senior Men's Foil, Senior Women's Sabre, Veteran Women's Sabre, and Veteran Women's Foil. NSW claimed gold in Senior Men's Sabre, plus gold and bronze in Senior Women's Foil, Veteran Men's Sabre, and Veteran Men's Foil.

Of the 4 Senior events, NSW gained 4 Gold, 2 Silver and 6 Bronze. Plus, 4 Gold, 2 Silver and 5 Bronze were gained in the Veteran events.

At the annual general meeting of members of the NSW Fencing Association on 26 February, Jing Shang was elected a Director for her second 4-year term.

At a meeting immediately after the AGM, Jing Shang was reappointed President, Duncan Fairweather as Vice President & Secretary, Adam O'Neil as Finance Director and John Frew as Regional Director.

32nd NSW State Schools Championships

Getting underway on Saturday 25 March, the School Championships will bring together primary & secondary school students, girls & boys, in individual and team contests in all three weapons.

As well as competing for individual medals, fencers will represent their schools in the Roberta Nutt, Roseanne White and AJ Rae Shields events.

It's important for parents to know that the Schools Championships are open to ALL school-age fencers, not just those who attend schools where fencing is an organised sport.

Participation requires Junior Participative membership of NSWFA and entry to each event. Note that each school fencer must register as a member individually (\$50) and tell their school their membership details. The school will look after entry for competitions but those who don't attend a fencing school will need to do their own competition entry (\$45).

Providing referees for Schools is a challenge and NSWFA appreciates the efforts made by schools to provide volunteer refs. This year a referee clinic will be held 30 minutes before the start of each competition to freshen up weapon rules and answer any questions from schools refs. These sessions will be led by coach Amelie Awong - former women's epee champion of France.



Sorry, We Got it Wrong

At a recent competition (Season Opener Veteran Epee) the two pools were drawn up 'manually' when the DT had a problem plugging State rankings into the pools allocation.

After pools, a protest was made that the imbalance in strength between the pools unfairly disadvantaged fencers in the stronger pool. While the outcome of the pools round could not be changed, NSWFA accepts this situation was not satisfactory.

In future, pools will always be allocated based on State rankings. If that can't be done for any reason, the DT will advise fencers before the pools round begins so they can raise any concerns about the composition of pools.

Fencing fires up in Newcastle as our Regional Director John Frew reports:

"Fencers from five clubs took to the piste at Northern Sport Fencing's first open competition of the year hosted by the Lake Macquarie PCYC. Regional open events are often considered a good grounding to competition fencing.

Fencers from Penrith Fencing and Silver Swords Academies made their way on the short journey north to compete with fencers from Newcastle PCYC, Lake Macquarie Fencing Club, Newcastle University and Maitland PCYC clubs.

In all, 25 fencers competed in open mixed foil, women's foil and mixed epee.

The 15 foil entries included 6 women, allowing a women's round won by Ashlin Stokes (Silver Swords) ahead of the silver medallist Lucy Fennell, with bronze to Noriko Fennell (Newcastle PCYC) and Colleen Stokes (Silver Swords).

Ashlin also won the mixed competition in a final contested with Anthony Birt (Newcastle PCYC) to make it two golds for her for the day. The bronzes were won by Wyatt Bax (Penrith) and Nicholas Stokes (Silver Swords).

The men's epee gold was won by resident "artiste on the piste" Alban Wallner (Newcastle PCYC) showing his customary precise line and powerful style, with Anthony Birt (Newcastle PCYC) taking his second silver for the day. Peter Hooker (Newcastle University) shared bronze with Rene Kopiec (Penrith)."




